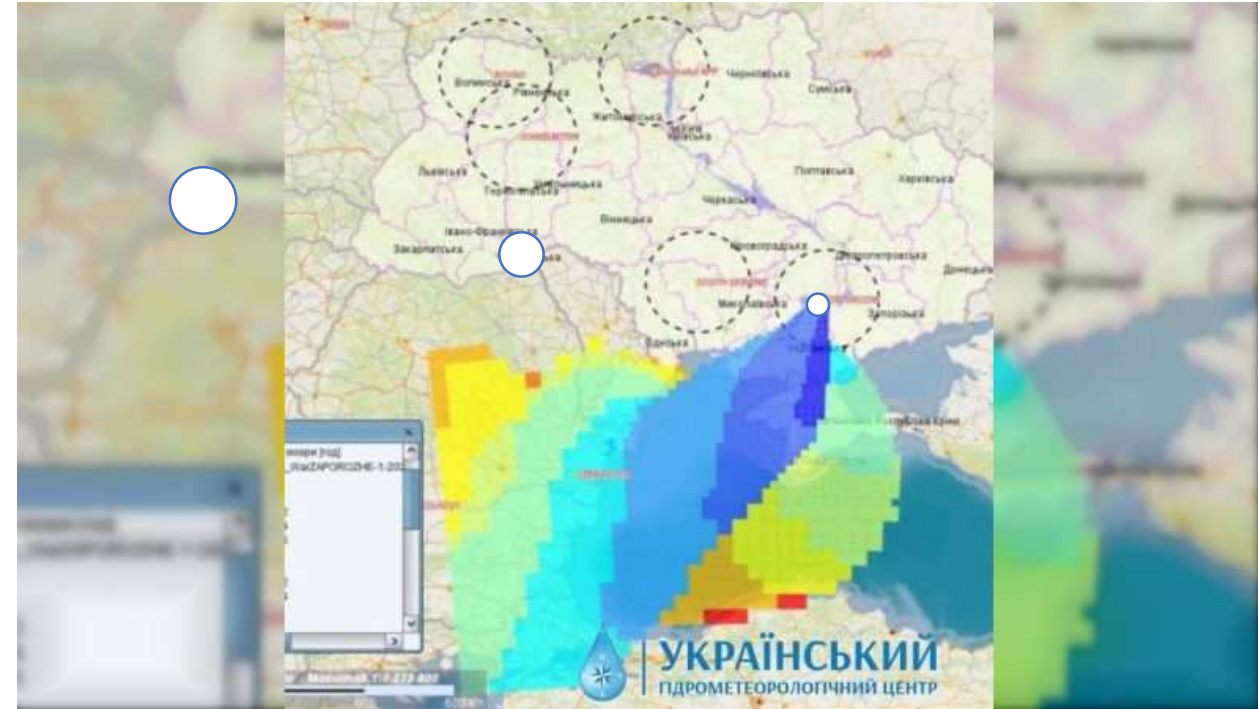


# A new threat

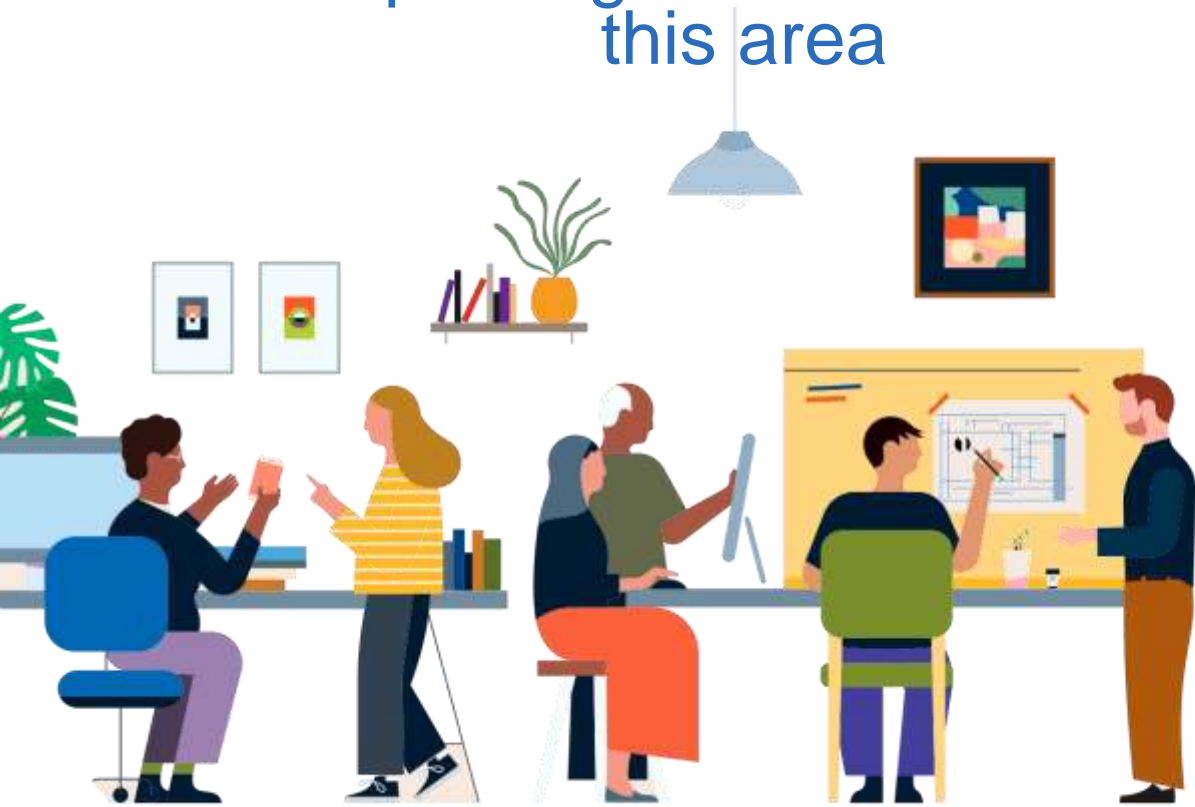
- Practice recommendations on conducting audits of assessing potential damages and minimizing the negative consequences of disasters





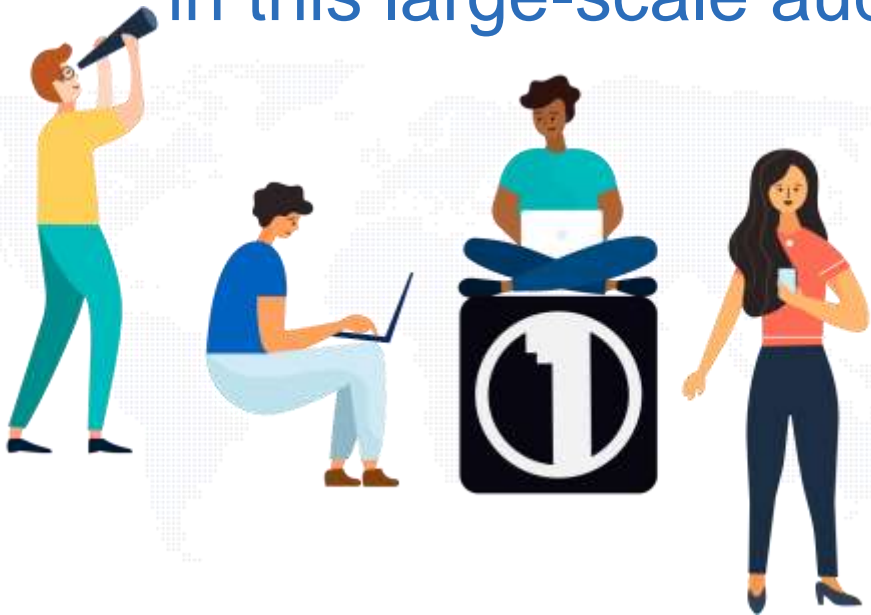
# The work on preparation has begun

- ✓ All members of our working group have been sent invitation letters to participate in this large-scale audit
