

The work on preparation has begun

 Joint Document regarding research on the effectiveness of national policies aimed at forest fire prevention and improving their activities in this area









Coordinated audit on the topic: "Governments' preparedness for disasters prevention and elimination of their consequences"

✓ A draft Common position on cooperation in conducting this audit has been prepared

All members of our working group have been sent invitation letters to participate in this large-scale audit
